What is different in Year 11?

- 9 (I)GCSE examined subjects
- 1 year left of a 2 year programme so it's important to improve an last year.
- Huge step up in difficulty from Year 10 to Year 11.
- Regular end of topic tests (internal)
- Mock (I)GCSE exams January of Year 11 and final exams at end of year
- Some formally assessed work during the year – counts towards final grade!
- Every lesson counts! Especially exam practice
- Grades in Year 11 will go on transcripts
- Time management is very important

Entry onto the IBDP:

- You need:
 - Minimum 3 B's, 2 C's
 - Maths / Physics A/A* other subjects B or above
 - To show you are capable of working at IBDP level
 - Approach to Learning Score
 - Attendance and Punctuality

 - Further Study / Moving school
 - Career

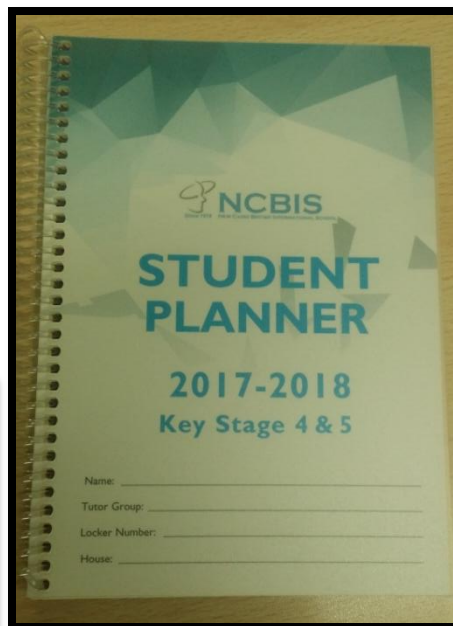

Student Planners:

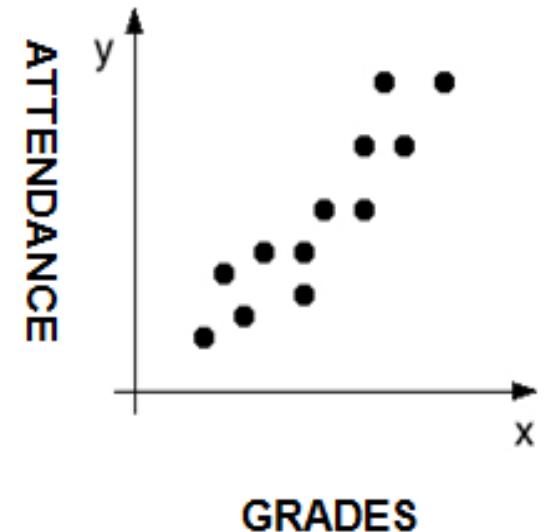
- Contains useful information for parents as well as students

- 4 - 6 hours at the weekend

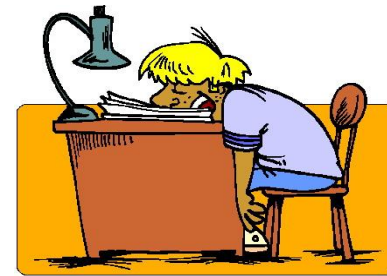
- This may not include 'set' homework. GCSE students are expected also to be organising and revising their work as the year progresses.

Ready to Learn?

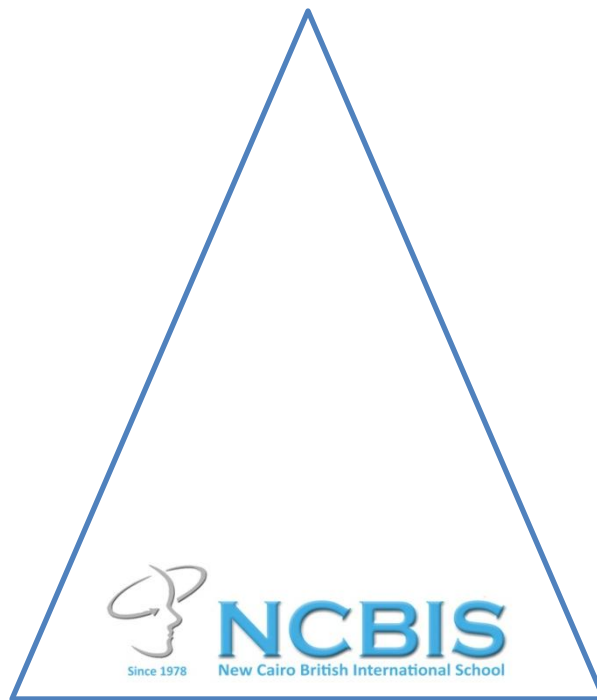
Routines are important!
